Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On July 28, 2018, the agency received a report regarding a 3-year-old child pronounced deceased at the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's unlicensed childcare provider and her significant other were criminally charged with possession of methamphetamine and chronic neglect of a child. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by the child's unlicensed childcare provider and the provider's significant other. The agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the child by an unknown maltreater. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries sustained by the child were non-accidental in nature. A separate Initial Assessment was completed by the agency with respect to the 5-year-old son of the unlicensed childcare provider and the provider's significant other. The child care provider's 5-year-old child was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. A Child in Need of Protection or Services Petition was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
