The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the 3-month-old infant and the infant's 1-year-old and 2-year-old siblings by an unknown maltreater. The infant and his siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed in a foster home. Children in Need of Protection and Services Petitions were filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
