On November 20, 2018, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On January 10, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the infant by the parents. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental trauma. The agency determined the infant unsafe, took Temporary Physical Custody, and placed him with relatives. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
