The following history is related to the infant's mother, who is now deceased:

On April 22, 2019, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the 10-month-old infant and her now 7-year-old half-brother, 5-year-old half-brother, 3-year-old half-brother, and 2-year-old half-sister by their mother. The infant died during the assessment period and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's death on June 11, 2019. An assessment was completed by the agency and the initial allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated.

On September 11, 2017, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the 10-month-old infant's now 7-year-old half-brother, 5-year-old half-brother, 3-year-old half-brother, and 2-year-old half-sister by their mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On September 14, 2016, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the 10-month-old infant's now 7-year-old half-brother, 5-year-old half-brother, and 3-year-old half-brother, by their mother, and unborn child abuse to the infant's now 2-year-old half-sister. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. A determination was made that services were not needed to address the allegation of unborn child abuse. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

There is no history related to the infant's uncle or the uncle's significant other.

Summary of actions taken by the agency under ch. 48, including any investigation of a report or referrals to services involving the child, any member of the child's family living in this household and the child's parents and alleged maltreater. (Does not include the current incident.)

The following history is related to the infant's mother, who is now deceased:

On April 9, 2013, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging sexual abuse to the 10-month-old infant's now 7-year-old half-brother by their mother. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of sexual abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

There is no history related to the infant's uncle or the uncle's significant other.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical personnel to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by her uncle. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to non-accidental head trauma. Toxicology results are pending. The infant's 5-year-old half-brother, 3-year-old half-brother, and 2-year-old half-sister were deemed unsafe in the home of the uncle and his significant other, with whom they were living at the time of the incident, and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The 5-year-old half-brother and 3-year-old half-brother were placed with relatives, and the 2-year-old half-sister was placed in a licensed foster home. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed on the three children and the case remained open for ongoing case management services.

The infant's three cousins, who were also living in the home at the time of the incident remained in the care of their mother, the infant's uncle's significant other, after she was assessed as protective. The infant's uncle was criminally charged and court ordered to have no contact with any child under the age of 16. The case pertaining to the infant's cousins was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
