The agency was also assessing a December 23, 2019 CPS Report. The last contact by the agency was a home visit with the father, the infant and the infant's brother on December 23, 2019.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect to the infant by the infant's father and to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death to be accidental. The infant's sibling and half-siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. The infant's father's significant other's children, who had resided in the same household as the infant, were also deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed for all of the children who were deemed unsafe, and the cases remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
