On September 23, 2008, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 16-year-old half-sibling and 13-year-old half-sibling by the mother and the half-siblings' father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was substantiated. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed on January 7, 2009, and the case was opened to provide ongoing case management services.

On June 18, 2008, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 16-year-old and 13-year-old half-siblings by the mother and the half-siblings' father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 28, 2008, the agency screened-in a Services Report. The family was unable to be located. Therefore, no service referrals were made, and the case was closed.

On November 16, 2007, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On November 12, 2007, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On May 1, 2007, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 16-year-old and 11-year-old half-siblings by the mother and the 11-year old half-sibling's father. An assessment was completed by the agency and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On July 12, 2005, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging emotional damage and neglect to the infant's then 13-year-old half-sibling by the mother and the 13-year-old half-sibling's father. An assessment was conducted, with an outcome of "unable to locate". The case was closed at Initial Assessment.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother and father. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained injuries consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in the hospital. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was placed in-home under a Protective Plan. The infant's siblings were deemed safe and remained with their mother and father. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
