**Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:**

On April 21, 2021, the agency received a report regarding an 8-month-old infant who was found unresponsive in the home of a licensed child care provider and was later pronounced deceased at the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the infant; toxicology results are pending. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

**Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:**

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found there was insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect by the licensed child care provider. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the infant. The infant's sibling was determined safe and remained with the mother. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment. The family was referred to community services and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
