**Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:**

On December 1, 2021, the agency received a report regarding a 5-month-old infant brought to the hospital with head injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. As a results of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's partner was criminally charged with Child Abuse-Intentionally Causing Great Bodily Harm and Strangulation and Suffocation. A criminal charge is merely an allegation and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

**Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:**

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the mother's partner and maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant was deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was placed in a non-relative foster home. The infant's siblings continued to reside with other relatives. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed for the infant, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
