### Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On January 12, 2022, the agency received a report regarding a 3-week-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's mother and maternal grandmother were both charged with Chronic Neglect of Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm). A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

### Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother and maternal grandmother. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with a relative. The infant's siblings did not reside in the home, and they remained in the care of the father. The mother was court-ordered to have no contact with the infant. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

At the time of the incident, the agency was assessing the December 22, 2021 CPS Report. The last contact by the agency was with the mother on January 11, 2022.

On December 22, 2021, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant by the mother. The infant sustained injuries during the assessment period, and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's injuries on January 12, 2022. An assessment of the allegation was completed by the agency, and the initial allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated.

On October 13, 2021, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant's now 3-year-old and now 4-year-old siblings by a family friend. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On November 19, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 4-year-old sibling by the mother and the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the initial assessment.
