An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The infant and his sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed. The infant's other siblings, who did not reside in the household, remained in the care of

	relative. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
