On March 21, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the 2-year-old child by an unknown maltreater. An Assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse was substantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On June 30, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 7-year-old half-sibling by the mother's uncle. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 30, 2017, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On May 23, 2017, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On October 4, 2016, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child's now 7-year-old half-sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The following history is related to the alleged maltreater:

On April 23, 2009, the agency screen-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the mother's significant other's now 14-year-old child by the mother's significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother's significant other and insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse of the child by his mother. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The child and his siblings were deemed unsafe, and the agency initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the Protective Plan was terminated, and the child and his siblings were taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The child and his 4-year-old sibling were placed with their father, and the child's 7-year-old half-sibling was placed with her father. The mother's significant other was criminally charged and court-ordered to have no contact with the child and the child's siblings. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
