The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father and insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse of the infant by the mother. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The father was criminally charged and court-ordered to have no contact with the infant and the infant's siblings. The agency determined the infant and his siblings safe, and they remained with their mother. The family was referred to community services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial
