Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On October 6, 2022, the agency received a report regarding a 3-year-old child who was brought to the hospital and later pronounced deceased. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office indicated the injuries were non-accidental in nature; the final autopsy report is pending. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother was charged with Neglecting a Child. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse of the child by an unknown maltreater and neglect of the child by the mother and the mother's significant other. The Medical Examiner's Office indicated the injuries were non-accidental in nature; the final autopsy report is pending. The child's siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

At the time of the incident, the child resided with his mother, his mother's significant other, his 2-year-old half-sibling, his 8-year-old half-sibling, and his mother's significant other's 15-year-old child. Also in the home was an unrelated adult and four unrelated children: a 1-year-old, a 3-year-old and a 10-year-old. The child's father did not have visitation.

At the time of the incident, the agency was assessing the September 30, 2022 CPS Report. The last contact by the agency was on October 4, 2022, with the mother and the mother's significant other.

On September 30, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging sexual abuse to the child by an unnamed maltreater. The child died during the assessment period, and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the child's death on October 6, 2022. An assessment of the initial allegation was completed, and the agency determined services were not needed regarding the allegations.

On July 29, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging sexual abuse to the child by an

unnamed maltreater. An assessment was completed by the agency with a determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On June 10, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child, the child's now 2-year-old half-sibling, and the child's now 8-year-old half-sibling by the mother and physical abuse to the child's now 8-year-old half-sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 12, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the child's now 2-year-old half-sibling and the child's now 8-year-old half-sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency with a determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 27, 2021, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On April 19, 2021, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child and the child's now 2-year-old sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On April 5, 2021, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child and the child's now 2-year-old sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On October 26, 2020, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child and physical abuse to the child's now 8-year-old sibling by a non-relative caregiver. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 26, 2020, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the child's now 8-year-old sibling by a relative caregiver and an unknown maltreater. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse by the relative was unsubstantiated. The allegation of physical abuse by an unknown maltreater was substantiated. The case remained open for ongoing voluntary in-home case management services.

On January 8, 2020, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the child's now 8-year-old sibling by an unknown maltreater. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

An assessment of the initial allegation was completed, and the agency determined services were not needed regarding the allegations.
