Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On October 17, 2022, the agency received a report regarding a 5-year-old child brought to the hospital with multiple injuries and later pronounced deceased. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death to be non-accidental. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's significant other was criminally charged with 2nd Degree Reckless Homicide, Neglecting a Child, and Possess Firearm – Convicted of a Felony. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by the mother's significant other. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death to be non-accidental. The family was referred to community services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
