Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On November 7, 2022, the agency received a report regarding a 1-year-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. No criminal charges were filed, and the case was closed.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found sufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse and sexual abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The agency also found sufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the infant by the mother and the father. The infant and her siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. Subsequently, the infant and her siblings were placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On October 18, 2021, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 10-year-old half-sibling by the infant's father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 20, 2021, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the infant by the mother DCF-F-2476-E (R. 04/2014)

and the father. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On March 4, 2021, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 8-year-old half-sibling, 10-year-old half-sibling, and 13-year-old half-sibling by a relative who lived in the home. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On May 13, 2019, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 8-year-old half-sibling by the infant's father and neglect to the infant's now 3-year-old sibling, 6-year-old sibling, 8-year-old half-sibling, 10-year-old half-sibling, and 13-year-old half-sibling by the mother, the infant's father, and the infant's 8-year-old and 10-year-old half-sibling's father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of physical abuse and neglect were substantiated. Petitions for Protection or Services for all five children were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On January 2, 2019, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 8-year-old half-sibling and now 10-year-old half-sibling by their father. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On December 27, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the infant's now 3-year-old sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

Petitions for Protection or Services for all five children were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On January 2, 2019, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 8-year-old half-sibling and now 10-year-old half-sibling by their father. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On December 27, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect to the infant's now 3-year-old sibling by the mother. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On December 21, 2018, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On October 12, 2017, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On June 6, 2017, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

On April 7, 2017, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect, sexual abuse, and physical abuse to the infant's now 8-year-old half-brother by the mother and the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect, sexual abuse, and physical abuse were unsubstantiated. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The agency also found sufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the infant by the mother and the father. The infant and her siblings were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. Subsequently, the infant and her siblings were placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
