Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On December 16, 2022, the agency received a report regarding a 4-year-old child with multiple injuries, who was pronounced deceased. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to non-accidental head trauma; the autopsy report is pending. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's caregiver's significant other was criminally charged with Physical Abuse of a Child, Repeated Acts Causing Death, 1st Degree Reckless Homicide, and Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death). The child's caregiver was criminally charged with Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death) and Chronic Neglect of a Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm). The child's caregiver's significant other's mother was criminally charged with Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Death). A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the caregiver's significant other and neglect of the child by the caregiver, the caregiver's significant other, and the caregiver's significant other's mother. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the death was due to non-accidental head trauma; the autopsy report is pending. The caregiver, caregiver's significant other, and the caregiver's significant other's mother were charged criminally, and the court ordered them to have no contact with the children. The agency determined the 5-year-old child of the caregiver and her significant other and the caregiver's 7-year-old child unsafe, and they were taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The 5-year-old child was placed with a relative. The 7-year-old child's father was assessed to be protective, and the 7-year-old child remained in his care. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services. The agency determined the 4-year-old child's 4-month-old half-sibling, who resided with their mother, safe and the half-sibling remained with the mother. The agency closed the child's mother's case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no referral to services were made.

On July 3, 2017, the agency screened-in a report alleging neglect to the child's caregiver's now 7-year-old and 5-year-old children by the mother their mother and the now 7-year-old child's father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The following history is related to the child's caregiver's significant other's mother:

On August 7, 2006, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to a now adult child by the mother (the caregiver's significant other's mother). An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
