**Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:**

On January 17, 2023, the agency received a report regarding an 11-year-old child with injuries who was brought to the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the child sustained an injury. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

**Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:**

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse of the child by an employee at the facility in which the child was placed. Medical professionals determined the child sustained an injury. The agency determined the child to be safe and he returned to the facility. Subsequently, the child returned to his mother's care, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

At the time of the incident, the child was residing in a licensed congregate care facility. The child was placed in congregate care by the Juvenile Court on September 1, 2022, due to concerns regarding his behavior in the community and his need for an increased level of supervision.

At the time of the incident, the child resided in a congregate care facility that is licensed for 53 children. At the time of the incident, there were 14 children residing in the facility.

The facility has maintained a congregate care facility license since 1979. The facility did not have any violations that constitute a substantial failure to protect and promote the welfare of a child.
