The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the 16-year-old by her mother and father. The agency deemed the 13-year-old and the 16-year-old's four siblings unsafe, Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and they remained with their mother and father. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services. The agency deemed an unrelated child in the home unsafe and that child's placement was legally changed to another foster home under an existing child protection order. The child's case remained open to provide ongoing case management.
