The family was referred to community services, and the case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the infant by an unknown maltreater. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma; the autopsy report is pending. The agency determined

	the infant's siblings safe, and they remained with their mother and father. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.
