Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On February 13, 2023, the agency received a report regarding a 2-week-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother was charged with Child Abuse-Fail/Prevent Great Harm and Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm), the father was charged with Physical Abuse of a Child, Repeated Acts Causing Great Bodily Harm and Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm), and the infant's maternal grandmother was charged with Child Abuse-Fail/Prevent Great Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater and neglect of the infant by the mother, father, and maternal grandmother. The agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate physical abuse to the infant by the father. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The infant and the infant's sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into custody and placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

At the time of the incident, the agency was assessing the January 26, 2023 CPS Report. The last contact with the agency was a home visit with the family on February 10, 2023.

On January 26, 2023, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the infant and the infant's 1-year-old sibling by the mother and the father. The infant sustained injuries during the assessment period, and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's injuries on February 13, 2023. An assessment of the allegation was completed by the agency, and the initial allegations of neglect were substantiated.

On October 13, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS report alleging neglect to the infant's 1-year-old sibling, 6-year-old half-sibling, and 8-year-old half-sibling by the father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
