On March 22, 2023, the agency received a report regarding a 7-year-old child brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. La enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the child sustained a serior injury. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's mother was criminally charged with Injury by Intoxicated U of a Vehicle, Cause Injury/OWI with a Passenger under 16, Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm), 1st-Degre Recklessly Endangering Safety, and Knowingly Operating While Suspended (Cause Great Bodily Harm). A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the child by the mother. Medical professionals determined the child sustained a serious injury. The child and his sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in non-relative foster homes.
