On April 7, 2023, the agency received a report regarding an 8-year-old child and a 4-year-old child with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the children's mother was criminally charged with Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Harm, Physical Abuse of a Child- Repeated Acts Causing Bodily Harm, Neglecting a Child (No Harm and Child <6 Years or Disability), Chronic Neglect of a Child (Consequence is Bodily Harm), and Chronic Neglect of a Child (Specified Harm Did Not Occur). As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the mother's significant other was criminally charged with Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Harm, Physical Abuse of a Child (Consequence is Bodily Harm), and Chronic Neglect of a Child (Specified Harm Did Not Occur).
