The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the cause of death to be non-accidental head trauma; toxicology results are pending. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by an unknown maltreater. The agency deemed the child's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan that was later transitioned to an in-home Safety Plan with the mother. An Informal Dispositional Agreement was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management.
