The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office has not determined the child's cause of death; the autopsy report is pending. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect to the child by the father's significant other. The agency deemed the child's sibling, half-siblings, and the significant other's children unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan that was later transitioned to an in-home Safety Plan with the child's father. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed for all five children, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
