The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office noted signs of trauma; the autopsy report is pending. The Initial Assessment found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother. The agency deemed the infant's siblings unsafe, and they were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were

filed, and the case remained open for ongoing case management services.
