Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On September 1, 2023, the agency received a report regarding a 2-month-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries alleged to have been caused on August 31, 2023. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the infant's father. The infant and his 1-year-old sibling and 5-year-old half-sibling were deemed unsafe, and the agency initiated a Protective Plan that was later transitioned into an in-home safety plan with the infant's mother. The infant's 7-year-old half-sibling and 9-year-old half-sibling were deemed safe, and they remained with the mother. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed for the infant and his 1-year-old sibling and 5-year-old half-sibling, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

On February 7, 2018, the agency screened-in a CPS report alleging physical abuse to the infant's now 5-year-old half-sibling by an unknown maltreater. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of physical abuse was DCF-F-2476-E (R. 04/2014)

substantiated. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed on February 22, 2018, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
