The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father. The infant was determined unsafe, and a Protective Plan was implemented. The father was court-ordered to have no contact with the infant. Subsequently, the mother was assessed as protective, and the infant remained in her care. The family was referred to community services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
