The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse of the infant by the father and neglect of the infant by the mother. The infant was deemed unsafe, and a Protective Plan was implemented. Upon discharge from the hospital, the infant was taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed in a non-relative foster home. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
