The child died during the period of time when the family was receiving voluntary services.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office noted no signs of trauma to the child; the autopsy report is pending. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the child by the mother. The child's siblings were deemed unsafe, and the agency initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the child's siblings were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
