On November 30, 2023, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the infant by the mother and father. The infant sustained a serious injury during the assessment period, and an additional report was made to the agency regarding the infant's injury on December 3, 2023. An assessment of the allegation was completed by the agency, and the initial allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated.

On July 24, 2023, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the infant by the mother and father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and the family was referred to community services.

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On July 24, 2023, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the infant by the mother and father. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and the family was referred to community services.

On May 24, 2023, the agency screened-out a Services Report.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater and neglect of the infant by the infant's mother and father. The infant and the infant's sibling were deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
