Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On December 23, 2023, the agency received a report regarding two 10-year-old half-siblings who were pronounced deceased and their 6-year-old half-sibling who was brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the three children's father was criminally charged with Operator Flee/Elude Officer – Death, Operator Flee/Elude Officer – Great Harm, Knowingly Operate w/out Valid License – Cause Death, Knowingly Operate w/out Valid License, Cause Great Bodily Harm, Injury by Use/Vehicle-Controlled Substance, and Homicide by Vehicle Use-Controlled Substance. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the two 10-year-old children and the 6-year-old child by the father. The agency determined the 6-year-old child safe, and the child remained with her mother. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.
