The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the father. The agency determined the child and the child's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan which subsequently transitioned to an in-home safety plan with the mother. An Informal Dispositional Agreement was filed, and the case remained opened for
