At the time of the incident, the family was receiving voluntary case management services through another agency. The last contact by that agency was a text message communication with the child's mother on March 8, 2024.

The following history is related to the child's mother.

On January 15, 2024, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging physical abuse of the child by the mother and sexual abuse of the child by the mother's ex-significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of physical abuse and sexual abuse were unsubstantiated. The case remained open to provide voluntary ongoing case management services.

On July 21, 2023, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of the child by the mother, physical abuse of the child by the mother's ex-significant other, and sexual abuse of the child by a peer. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect, physical abuse and sexual abuse were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The following history is related to the child's father.

On September 29, 2022, another agency screened-in a Services Report. The family was offered voluntary community services.

On July 1, 2021, another agency screened-in a Services Report. The agency was unable to make contact with the family, and the case was closed.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the child by the mother's significant other. The child's 6-month-old sibling was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with relatives. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
