Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On April 11, 2024, the agency received a report regarding a 1-year-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained serious injuries. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the infant's unlicensed child care provider was charged with Child Abuse-Recklessly Cause Great Harm- Felony E and Neglecting a Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm). A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the infant sustained serious injuries. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse and neglect to the infant by the unlicensed child care provider. The agency determined the infant and the infant's half-siblings safe, and the infant and the infant's half-siblings remained with the mother and father. The agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment, and no service referrals were made.
