The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the infant's father and an unknown maltreater. The agency deemed the infant and the infant's sibling unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the infant and the infant's sibling were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. The infant's father was court ordered to have no contact with the infant or the infant's sibling. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
