An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was substantiated. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed on June 1, 2023, and the case remains open to provide ongoing case management.

The following history is related to the infant's grandmother:

On April 12, 2002, the agency screened-out a CPS Report.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect to the infant by the mother and maternal grandmother. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency also found insufficient evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse by the mother, the grandmother, and an unknown alleged maltreater. Autopsy results are pending, and the official cause of the infant's death is unknown; toxicology results were negative. The agency deemed the infant's 2-year-old sibling unsafe, and the child remained in the care of a non-relative foster home. The case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
