The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office indicated the death was consistent with non-accidental head trauma; the autopsy is pending. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by an unknown maltreater. The agency deemed the infant's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
