Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:
On July 11, 2024, the agency received a report regarding a 10-month-old infant found unresponsive in his home. The infant was transported to the hospital and subsequently pronounced deceased on July 17, 2024. Law enforcement was contacted and initiate a criminal investigation. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the infant's stepmother was criminally charged with 1 st -Degree Reckles Homicide. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:
The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner' Office determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The Initial Assessment completed by the agence found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the stepmother. The infant siblings were deemed unsafe and taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The infant's 8-year-old half-sibling and 7-year-old sibling were placed with a relative, and the infant's other siblings were placed in non-relative foster homes. The infant's stepmother was criminally charged, and court ordered to have no contact with the infant's siblings. Children in Need of Protection or Services Petitions were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
