The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries to be accidental. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the child by an unknown maltreater. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the child by the child's mother and father. The agency deemed the child and his siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the mother and father were assessed as protective, and the child and his siblings returned with the mother and father. An Informal Dispositional Agreement was filed,
