On July 11, 2023, another agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect of unrelated children, now 3 years old and 2 years old, by the mother's significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On January 17, 2024, the agency received a report alleging neglect of the infant's now 4-year-old half-sibling and 1-year-old sibling by the father of the infant and the infant's 1-year-old sibling. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the

allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On February 10, 2021, another agency screened-in a CPS Report for Alternative Response alleging neglect and physical abuse of unrelated children, now 12 years old and 7 years old, by the mother's significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency with the determination of services not needed. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On January 17, 2024, the agency received a report alleging neglect of the infant's now 4-year-old half-sibling and 1-year-old sibling by the father of the infant and the infant's 1-year-old sibling. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegation of neglect was unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

Summary of any investigation involving the child, any member of the child's family and alleged maltreater conducted under ch. 48 and any services provided to the child and child's family since the date of the incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate physical abuse of the infant by an unknown maltreater and neglect of the infant by the mother and the mother's significant other. The agency deemed the infant and the infant's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the infant and her siblings were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with relatives. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
