Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On November 20, 2024, the agency received a report regarding a 1-year-old infant brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. As a result of law enforcement’s investigation, the child’s non-relative caregiver was criminally charged with 1st Degree Reckless Injury and Child Abuse-Recklessly Cause Great Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect and physical abuse of the infant by the non-relative caregiver. The Initial Assessment also found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the father. The child was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed in a non-relative foster home. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
