The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental head trauma. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the mother. The agency deemed the infant and the infant's siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently the infant and the infant's siblings were taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. The infant was placed in a non-relative foster
