An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect and sexual abuse were unsubstantiated. The family was referred to community services, and the case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

On September 21, 2022, the agency screened-in a CPS Report alleging neglect to the child and the child's now 12-year-old half-sibling by the mother's significant other. An assessment was completed by the agency, and the allegations of neglect were unsubstantiated. The case was closed upon completion of the Initial Assessment.

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's office determined the child's death was non-accidental in nature. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by the mother's cousin. The family was referred to community services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
