The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Medical Examiner's Office determined the child died as a result of a serious injury. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the child by an unknown maltreater. The child's 1-month-old infant was deemed unsafe, taken into Temporary Physical Custody, and placed with a relative. The child's siblings were deemed safe and remained in the care of their father. A Petition for Protection or Services was filed for the child's infant, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
