Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On July 29, 2025, the agency received a report regarding a 10-year-old child brought to the hospital with multiple injuries. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals determined the injuries were consistent with non-accidental trauma. As a result of law enforcement’s investigation, one of the child’s legal guardians was charged with Physical Abuse of a Child-Repeated Acts Causing Bodily Harm, Child Abuse-Intentionally Cause Great Bodily Harm, Strangulation and Suffocation. The child’s other legal guardian was charged with Chronic Neglect of a Child-Consequence Bodily Harm and Child Abuse-Fail to Prevent Bodily Harm. A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse and neglect of the child by her legal guardians. The child and the guardians’ children were deemed unsafe, and a Protective Plan was initiated. Subsequently, the child and the guardians’ children were taken into Temporary Physical Custody. The child and the guardians’ 11-year-old child were placed in non-relative foster homes, and the guardians’ 12-year-old child was placed in a like-kin home. The guardians were court-ordered to have no contact with the child or their children. Petitions for Protection or Services were filed, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.
