Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect:

On August 21, 2025, the agency received a report regarding a 14-year-old child who was unresponsive and brought to the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. Medical professionals' preliminary findings indicated the child was malnourished. As a result of law enforcement's investigation, the child's father and step-mother were criminally charged with Chronic Neglect of a Child (Consequence is Great Bodily Harm) and Chronic Neglect of a Child (Consequence is Emotional Damage). A criminal charge is merely an allegation, and a defendant is presumed innocent until and unless proven guilty.

Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident:

The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of neglect of the child by the father, step-mother, adult sibling, and the adult sibling's partner. The agency deemed the child unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently, the child was taken into Temporary Physical Custody and placed with a relative. The child's 15-year-old step-sibling was deemed safe, and the step-sibling remained with his mother and the child's father. A Petition for Protection and Services was filed for the 14-year-old child, and the case remained open to provide ongoing case management services.

The child's 11-year-old and 17-year-old half-siblings resided with the child's mother. The child's mother did not have regular visitation with the child.
