

ORAL CASE PRESENTATION TOOL

Initial Juvenile Justice PRT

Instructions to the Juvenile Justice Ongoing Case Manager & Supervisor:

Use the outline below to prepare your **20-minute** oral case presentation for the child's Permanency Roundtable. It is recommended that a genogram and timeline with the removal date, subsequent placement dates and type of placements are developed for the presentation.

1. Briefly describe the youth (age, gender), the youth's family (including any siblings in or out of custody), and the youth's current living situation.
2. When was the youth originally removed from his/her home? Has the youth been in more than one out of home placement, briefly describe the reasons and placement types.
3. What were the original community safety issues that prompted the removal of the youth?
4. Have any new safety issues emerged since placement?
5. What is the current status of the youth's dangerous or unsafe behavior?
6. If applicable, has the youth participated in community service, paid restitution, or made a mends with the victim? Please state the circumstances.
7. Does the youth and parent/caregiver have any interactions, if so, how often, how consistent, what is the length of the interactions (day, overnight, weekend, etc.)?
8. Have there been any positive changes in the youth's behavior, attitudes, motivation, and interactions to be safely returned home? Has the parent demonstrated any positive changes to ensure a safe environment for the youth?
9. Describe the youth's issues, challenges, needs (physical, social, emotional, behavioral and developmental) that may be affecting progress toward permanency.
10. Describe the youth's current educational needs.
11. Describe the youth's and parent(s)' issues, challenges, needs that may be affecting progress toward permanency.
12. Would the parents/caregivers be willing and capable of supporting reunification?
13. State the current permanency plan for this youth; if it is not reunification, please explain.
14. Describe the services and supports being provided for this youth and family, indicating what is/is not working and in your opinion why.
15. Describe any court processes that may be affecting progress toward permanency in this case.
16. Describe other significant relationships with caring adults in the youth's life.
17. Describe other issues, challenges, needs that may be affecting progress toward permanency.
