Wisconsin Indian Child Welfare Act (WICWA): Qualified Expert Witness Re:

PURPOSE

This memo provides guidance and resource information for consistent application of the WICWA Qualified Expert Witness statutory provisions (s. 48.028 (2)(g) and (4)(f)).

BACKGROUND

The Wisconsin Indian Child Welfare Act (WICWA) mandates the testimony of Qualified Expert Witnesses (QEW) in proceedings in which the placement of an Indian child in out-of-home care or the involuntary termination of parental rights involving an Indian child is being pursued. The Wisconsin Indian Child Welfare Act (WICWA) State Advisory Board, which is composed of county, tribal, legal, and other stakeholders with expertise in tribal child welfare issues collaborated with the Department of Children and Families to develop guidance for consistent application of the WICWA Qualified Expert Witness provisions and provide critical resource information in order to assist in the implementation of §48.028 (2)(g) and (4)(f). The guidance is provided in the attached document.

INFORMATION SUMMARY

The attached Implementing Guidelines provide information on the background and purpose of the Qualified Expert Witness provisions in WICWA, defines the tiers of QEW witnesses, describes the scope of the expert witness testimony, and provides resources for qualified expert witnesses.
