## **PURPOSE**

This communication is intended to provide updated guidance to licensed child welfare facilities regarding the expiration of the COVID-19 emergency declarations. This document is meant to replace all prior DCF guidance issued by DCF with regards to the COVID-19 emergency declarations.

## **BACKGROUND**

In early 2020, there were multiple declarations of emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic, including a declaration of a Public Health Emergency by the United States Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and major disaster declarations by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

In response to the declaration of the public health emergency, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) issued specific guidance for licensed congregate care providers to assist in navigating the pandemic. DCF also required licensed congregate care providers to report all instances of staff or children that tested positive for COVID-19 to Child Welfare Licensing. The DHHS Public Health Emergency and the FEMA major disaster declarations related to COVID-19 will expire on May 11, 2023.

## INFORMATION SUMMARY

In conjunction with the expiration of the public health emergency, DCF will be removing congregate care specific COVID-19 guidance documents from its website and congregate care





providers will no longer be required to report instances of COVID-19 in their facilities after May 11, 2023.

As the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency comes to an end, all congregate care providers should continue to follow basic health guidelines to prevent the spread of COVID-19. For specific recommendations, please visit the <u>Wisconsin Department of Health Services</u> website. If a worker or resident in a congregate care facility is diagnosed with COVID-19, the provider should continue to coordinate with <u>local public health officials</u> to receive further guidance on infection prevention and control as necessary.
