**High-cost Pool Fund for Tribal Court Placements** Re:

# PURPOSE

This memo explains the process for accessing High-Cost Pool funds for unusually high-cost out-of-home care placements of Indian Juveniles who have been adjudicated delinguent by tribal court. The High-Cost Pool does not supplant the overall responsibility of county human/social service agencies to pay for placements ordered by tribal courts under 161 Agreements.

High-Cost Pool funds can be requested as supplemental funding to meet the specific needs of Indian children placed by a tribal court where the costs significantly affect the county or tribal out-of-home care budget. Requests can be made for specific children in situations where the county or tribe meets the High-Cost Pool requirements.

This memo supersedes DSP Memo Series 2016-39i.

# BACKGROUND

Wisconsin statute s. 938.485(4) allows the Department of Children and Families (DCF) to reimburse Indian tribes and county departments "for unexpected or unusually high-cost out-ofhome care placements of Indian Juveniles who have been adjudicated delinquent by tribal courts." The phrase "unusually high-cost out-of-home placements" means "the amount by which the cost to an Indian tribe or to a county department of out-of-home care placements of Indian juveniles who have been adjudicated delinguent by tribal courts exceeds \$50,000 in a fiscal year." A total of \$75,000 is provided through 2009 Wisconsin Act 28 to reimburse tribes and counties each state fiscal year through this program.





On January 1, 2016, DCF assumed responsibility for the community-based juvenile justice system. This change included the transfer of responsibility for this program under Wis. Stat. s. 938.485(4) to DCF.

## **INFORMATION SUMMARY**

Tribal Out-of-Home Care Placements

- A. Accessing Funds:
  - 1. A tribe and a county must submit a joint application for the county to receive funds. This applies to situations where the county is paying for placements made by the tribal court.
  - 2. A tribe may submit an individual application if the tribe is paying for placements made by the tribal court.
  - 3. The tribe and county, for a joint application, or a tribe for an individual application must expend a minimum of \$50,000 for out-of-home care costs to access the High-Cost Pool fund.
- B. Eligibility of Placements:
  - 1. Eligible youth are Indian juveniles who have been adjudicated delinquent by a tribal court.
  - 2. The tribe and county, for a joint application, or a tribe for an individual application must expend a minimum of \$50,000 for out-of-home care costs-
- C. Award Calculation Formula:
  - 1. The Department will prorate the funds based on each county or tribe's percentage of the total expenditures, above the \$50,000 threshold. To determine each award, the Department will use the following calculations:
    - i. Total allowable expenditures are submitted by an individual jurisdiction.
    - ii. \$50,000 is subtracted from the total expenditures on each application to determine an adjusted expenditure.
    - iii. The sum of all adjusted expenditures across all applicants' equal total expenditures eligible for reimbursement.
    - iv. Each applicant's adjusted expenditures are divided by the total expenditures eligible for reimbursement to determine their percentage of that total.
    - v. That percentage is multiplied by the available funds, \$75,000, to determine each applicant's award amount.

## **REQUESTS FOR FUNDING**

- 1. Requests must be made on a form prescribed by the Department. Placement requests must identify the actual duration of the placement during the application period, the placement provider, and the actual cost for that particular child.
- High-Cost Pool funds are available during each State fiscal year. This application period will <u>cover expenditures from January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024</u>. All applications are <u>due by March 31, 2025</u>. The portion of the request not funded remains the fiscal responsibility of the county or tribe.
- 3. All applications must include proof of payment for each child.
- 4. All applications must include a copy of the Tribal Court Order, placing the child in each placement.





5. Incomplete documentation will not be considered for reimbursement.

## **ACTION SUMMARY**

Those seeking to access High-Cost Pool funds must inform the Tribal Affairs Specialist of your intent to apply by March 1, 2025. You will then receive access to a SharePoint site where you will upload the attached application and supporting documentation for each child listed on the application by March 31, 2025.
